

To determine lines & corners of S 1/2 of NE 1/4 Sec 28 also NE Cor Sec 28

Measurements made with Stadia began at S 1/4 cor Sec 22 West  
 the River.  
 opposite bank  
 set first temp SW cor Sec 22 Not finding the corner we dug with Picks & finally gave it up & ran on West  
 The S 1/4 cor Sec 21 falls South 128.4 ch This corner must have been marked with Johnsons record (corroborated)  
 Proceed to East 1/4 Sec 28 Ran North  
 set Temp 1/4 cor  
 intersect Random line Ex West between S 1/4 cor Sec 22 & S 1/4 cor Sec 21 as previously run & set Temp Sec Cor  
 The W 1/4 cor Sec 22 No falling  
 Returned to temporary Sec cor of SW cor Sec 22 & set and established a corner at proportional distance marked it plain a granite  
 Boulder. A Columnar bears S 26 30 W 170 ch. A Columnar 11' dia N 72 W 230 ch  
 Connected Temp 1/4 to true line & proportional distance and proceeded to the E 1/4 cor Sec 28 ran West one mile  
 The W 1/4 cor Sec 28 No falling Established the centre of the section as half way of this line. set a Rock mark + c.s.  
 Then from W 1/4 cor Sec 28 ran South set a temp 1/4 cor at 20 ch  
 To the established centre Sec 28 back & connected Temp 1/4 cor to true line and set 20.64 ch from W 1/4 cor set permanent corner  
 which is  
 a Rock marked & set well.
