

## SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH O.R.S. 209.250

Survey For: U. S. Forest Service  
Umatilla National Forest  
2517 S. W. Hailey Avenue  
Pendleton, OR 97801

Location: Located in Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 31 East  
of the Willamette Meridian, Grant County, Oregon.

Purpose: To mark the North and East lines of the Southwest quarter  
and the South line of the Southeast quarter of said  
Section 25 as the Forest Service Property Boundary.

Procedure: A series of closed traverses was run to all controlling  
corners as shown on the accompanying map. The B.L.M.  
brass cap monuments found along the East line of Section  
25 are marked 1968. This indicates that these monuments  
were set just 12 short years ago and it is inexcusable  
that the B.L.M. has not made the record of them available  
to the public. It was only through the C.O.R. for this  
project that I acquired copies of the unofficial version  
of these monuments. It became a point of interest when  
reviewing these unofficial notes as to the evidence re-  
covered by the B.L.M. at the 1/4 corner common to Sections  
25 and 30. The notes say "The 1/4 section corner of  
sections 25 and 30, evidenced by a mound of stone in an  
old fence line extending North and South. This point is  
accepted as the best available evidence of the position  
of the original corner and is in good harmony with sur-  
rounding identified corners." This statement was found  
to be of questionable veracity in that no north-south  
fenceline is in existence now nor is there any evidence  
of one ever having been there. With this information  
being considered I tied the Northeast and the Southeast  
corners of Section 25, which are also unofficial B.L.M.  
monuments, but were set from original evidence. These  
corners were checked and were in reasonable positions.  
The proportionate position of the quarter corner of  
sections 25 and 30 was computed and a field search for  
the original stone was made. My proportionate position  
lies N79°19'00"W 10.17 feet from the B.L.M. monument.  
The B.L.M. monument is standing in a large mound of stone.  
These stones were surely gathered from the close proximity  
of the B.L.M. monument. Within the mound there are a  
number of stones which could possibly be the original  
stone. If one of them is in fact the original stone its  
original position is indiscernable. I search the area  
very carefully for the original stone with no success.  
Because of the obvious discrepancy with the B.L.M. un-  
official notes I set the quarter corner at the propor-  
tionate position as shown on my map.

With the East quarter corner of Section 25 now thus  
established I subdivided the section as shown on the  
accompanying map and marked the Forest Boundary. The  
boundary was marked with six foot steel fence posts with  
Forest Boundary signs attached.

The remainder of the controlling corners were previously  
remonumented from original evidence by a Registered  
Land Surveyor.

The following corner monuments and accessories were  
recorded at the corners:
